extranement. metaphor for the life of a wife, marked by milestones and tradition

It can sew, it can cook, it can talk, talk, talk. It works, there is nothing wrong with it. You have a hole, it's a poultice. You have an eye, it's an image. My boy, it's your last resort. Will you marry it, marry it, marry it.

repetition of dehumanising language. repetition; negative connotation of having a voice. functional/machination of women no substance. remedies/home medicine/solution. comparative you fit. it as wife, and marriage/double meaning. only option; conformity.

insistence and repetition. No question mark is intentional. There is no choice. 11 October 1962

There is a tone of irony in the fact that a choice is given, when realistically there is no option for either the applicant or the wife.

## Major concerns

- \* Marriage union / patriarchy
- \* anger / outrage / sorrow
- \* parody of the institution of marriage -> specifically the superficiality of selecting a partner
- \* marriage as an arrangement; not emotional attachment
- \* the objectification of women, both within the marriage union and in society at large.
- \* poem expresses anger towards socially constructed femininity as passive and obedient.
- \* job seeking as central metaphor -> capitalist society
